
This manual provides information about the hardware and software features of your Orbic Joy.

# **Getting Started**

This guide helps you learn about your device hardware, assembly procedures, and how to get started using your device.

# **Device Overview**



Keys	Description
Headphone Jack	To insert the headphones.
Front Camera	To take pictures and videos of yourself.
Volume Key	To adjust the volume of your device's sound and audio playback.
Power/Lock Button	To turn the device ON/OFF.
Back Camera & Flash	To take pictures and videos. Light up subjects in low-light environments when taking pictures or recording video.
SIM Card Tray	To insert SIM/microSD card.
USB Type-C Charging Port	To charge the mobile.
Speaker	To listen to the music or ringtone.
Microphone	To record audio and detect voice commands

# Assemble Your Device

It is necessary to install the SIM card and memory card and charge the battery before use.


Your device uses a nano SIM card. A SIM card may be preinstalled or may be able to use your previous SIM card.

# Replacing the SIM Card/microSD Card

Your device comes with a pre-installed SIM card.

If you wish to change or remove the SIM card or install a microSD, power OFF the device and follow the below steps:

- Insert the SIM pin tool into the SIM pinhole on the tray to open the tray.
- Insert the microSD card with the gold contacts facing down and close the tray.




# **Charging the Battery**

Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery.

Warning! Use only approved charging devices and batteries. Using other accessories may void your warranty and may damage your device.

- 1. Plug the USB cable into the USB power adapter.
- 2. Plug the power adapter into a standard outlet.
- Plug the other end of the USB cable into the phone's micro USB port.
- 4. The USB icon on the cable should always face up when connecting the cable to your device, as shown.



### NOTE:

- Charge your device's battery with the device turned OFF to maximize efficiency.
- · Over time, battery life decreases steadily.
- Do not charge the battery for longer than eight hours.

# **Set up Your Device**

# **Turn Your Device ON/OFF**

The instructions below explain how to turn your device ON or OFF.

### To Turn the Device ON

 Press and hold the Power/Lock key until the device turns ON.

NOTE: The first time you use your phone, you'll need to set it up.

### To Turn the Device OFF

- If the display is off, press **Power/Lock** to turn it back on.
- Press and hold Power/Lock for a few seconds.
- When the phone options menu appears, tap Power OFF.
- Tap **OK**.

# **Initial Setup**

The first time you turn your device ON (or after a reset to factory settings), the on-screen prompts guide you through the basics of setting up your device.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, set up accounts, choose location services, learn about your device's features, and more.

# Secure Your Device

Use your device's screen lock features to secure your device. To choose more screen lock options, see Screen lock.

- To lock the device, press the Power key.
- To unlock the device, press the Power key and swipe up to unlock.

# **Set Up Account on Your Device**

# Google™ Account

Your new device uses your Google account to fully utilize its Android features, including Gmail, and the Google Play Store. When you turn on your device for the first time, set up a connection with your existing Google account, or create a new Google account.

To create a Google account, or set up your Google account on your device, see <u>Passwords & accounts</u>.

From Home screen, tap Settings > Passwords & accounts > Add account > Google.

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# **Know Your Device**

# **Home Screen**

The Home screen serves as the start of your experience.



The Home screen is displayed when the device is in idle mode.

The Home screen allows you to add shortcuts, folders, and widgets to your favorite apps to be easily accessible.

### To access the Home screen

Tap O to return to the center of the Home screen.

# **Previewing the Home Screen**

From the Home screen, tap and hold the desired application. The application moves to your selected home screen once you choose it.

# **Customizing the Home Screen**

You can customize the home screen and the display wallpaper.

# Moving an Item on the Home Screen

# To move/drag an item on the home screen

- 1. Open the Home screen you want to customize.
- 2. Tap and hold the item you want to move until it vibrates.
- 3. Drag the item to a new location on your Home screen.
- 4. Point your finger at the location where you want the item.

**NOTE**: To add shortcuts to a Home screen, swipe up from your app list to reveal all your applications. Next, find the app you wish to add, tap and hold on the item, and drag it onto the Home screen.

### Removing an Item from the Home Screen

### To remove an item from the home screen

- 1. From the Home screen, tap and hold an item until it vibrates.
- 2. Drag the item to **X Remove** to remove the item.

### Changing the Wallpaper of the Home Screen

- From the Home screen, tap and hold any empty area on the Home screen for a few seconds.
- Tap Wallpapers. Choose a photo from your camera gallery or memory card.
- 3. Tap Set Wallpaper.

# Widgets

Widgets are extensions for applications that appear on the Home screen. Widgets include links to a specific contact, Internet bookmarks, Gmail and email accounts, and many more.

# Add a Widget to a Home Screen

- Touch and hold any empty area on the Home screen > select Widgets.
- Touch and hold the required widget, drag it to the Home screen and release it.

### Remove a Widget

- Touch and hold the widget you want to remove from the Home screen.
- 2. Drag the widget to X Remove and release it.

**NOTE:** By removing a widget, you are not deleting it but rather removing it from the Home screen.

# App Shortcuts

You can add a shortcut to the Home screen.

# Adding an App Shortcut

- Touch and hold any preloaded or downloaded app on the device screen.
- 2. Drag the app to the Home screen and release it.

# Removing the Shortcut

- Touch and hold the app shortcut you want to remove from the Home screen.
- 2. Drag the app shortcut to X Remove and release it.

# **Folders**

Use folders to organize items on your Home screen.

# Creating/Removing a Folder

- 1. Drag one application over another to create a folder.
- You can name a folder and drag other applications into it after it is created.
- You can move folders in the same way that you move applications.
- 4. To remove a folder, touch and hold the folder that you want to remove, drag the folder to **X Remove** and release it.

# **Status Bar**

The Status Bar at the top of the home screen provides device information (such as network status, battery charge, and time) on the right side and notification alerts on the left.

# **Touchscreen Gestures**

Тар	You can select on-screen items such as application icons or settings buttons by touching them with your finger.
Tap and Hold	Touch and hold your finger over the item to open its options.
Swipe or Slide	Drag your finger horizontally or vertically across the screen.
Drag	Tap and hold your finger before you begin to drag and hold your finger down until the item reaches your desired location.
Flick	Swiping the screen is similar to flicking, but you need to swipe it with lighter and quicker strokes instead.
	Finger gestures are always vertical. For example, flicking through contacts or messages.
Rotate	You can change the orientation of most screens from portrait to landscape simply by turning the phone sideways. Turning the phone sideways will bring up a larger on-screen keyboard.

# **Notification Panel**

A notification icon displays calendar events, device status, and other information on the Status Bar.

### Viewing and Responding to Notifications

- Tap and hold the Status bar, and slide your finger downward to open the Notifications panel.
- If you have multiple notifications, you may have to scroll to see them all.
- 3. Tap the desired notification to respond.

# **Using the On-screen Keyboard**

Type your text input using the onboard keyboard. The keyboard opens automatically in some applications. For others, tap anywhere in a text field to launch the keyboard.

- 1. Tap each letter on the on-screen keypad.
- Tap and hold a letter for additional key options (not all keys have additional options). Additional key options include numbers and letters with accent marks. If options are available, you will see a box with all the options shown. Slide your finger to select the character you want.
- 3. You may continue until the word is complete.

**NOTE**: You can select input methods when typing in the notification panel.

# **User Dictionary**

The predictive text dictionary may require the addition of a word, for example, a name or a technical term.

# **Adding a Word Manually**

- From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your Apps > tap Settings 
   .
- 5. Scroll down and tap the System icon.
- 6. Tap Language & input.
- 7. Tap Personal Dictionary and tap the plus sign + .
- Type the new word > Enter the shortcut key, if required > tap

   to save the word.

# **Editing/Deleting a Word**

- From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your Apps > tap Settings .
- 10. Scroll down and tap the System.
- 11. Tap Language & input > Personal dictionary.
- 12. Choose the word you wish to delete.
- 13. Tap 📺 to delete the word.

# **Editing Text**

You can select, copy or cut the text you've entered, then paste it in another text field within the user interface.

**NOTE**: Some applications may offer different text editing methods.

### Select the Text

- 1. Tap the text field.
- 2. Move the cursor to the beginning or end of the desired text by tapping in the location you want the cursor.
- 3. Tap and hold the text field.
- Tap Select word in the pop-up menu or tap Select all to select all the text in the text field.
- Drag your finger to move the text cursor to the letter within the text that you want to select. The selected text is highlighted in orange.

# **Cut/Copy the Text**

- Double-click to select the text to cut or copy it.
- 2. Tap and hold the selected text.
- 3. Tap **Cut** or **Copy** in the menu that opens.
- If you tap Cut, the selected text is removed from the text field. In this case, the text is saved to the clipboard so you can paste it into another text field.

### **Paste the Text**

- 1. Cut or copy the text to paste.
- 2. Tap the text field where you want to paste the text and move the cursor to your desired location.
  - You can paste text that you copied from one application into the text field in any other application.

- 3. Tap and hold > select **Paste** in the pop-up menu.
  - The text is inserted after the cursor. The text remains in the clipboard so that you can paste that exact text into another location.

# Selecting Text

You can select, copy or cut the text you've entered, then paste it in another text field within the user interface.

**NOTE:** Some applications may offer different text editing methods.

### To select a text

- 1. Tap the text field.
- Move the cursor to the beginning or end of the desired text by tapping in the location you want the cursor.
- 3. Tap and hold the text field.
- Tap Select word in the pop-up menu or tap Select all to select all the text in the text field.
- Drag your finger to move the text cursor to the letter within the text that you want to select.

# **Glide Typing**

The Google Keyboard lets you slide your finger across the letters to spell the word.

### To enable glide typing

- Touch and hold the comma (,) > tap > Glide typing.
- Tap •• to Enable glide typing ON/OFF. Slide your finger from letter to letter to spell a word.
- Do not lift your finger until you have completed spelling a word.

# **Google Voice Typing**

Google voice typing uses Google voice recognition to convert speech to text.

### To use Google voice typing to enter text

- - -or-
- Touch and hold the **Keyboard settings** on the keyboard, and enable tap **Google voice typing**.

# **Screen Timeout/Sleep Mode ON**

Sleep mode saves battery power by turning off your display. You will still receive messages and calls when the display is turned off.

# Switching to Screen timeout mode

- Press Power/Lock to switch your phone to Screen timeout mode.
- Your phone automatically turns OFF the display after a period of inactivity.

### To customize the screen timeout settings

 From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your Apps > Settings > Display > Screen timeout.

### Waking up from Screen timeout mode

- Your phone automatically wakes up when you have an incoming call.
- To wake it up manually, press Power/Lock and the screen must be unlocked.

# **Adjusting Volume**

Ringtone and Media volume is independent of each other and adjusted separately.

### **Adjusting the Ringer Volume**

From the Home screen, press **Volume up** or **Volume down** on the right side of the phone to:

- · Adjust the ringer volume to your desired level.
- While in the lowest ringer volume level, press Volume Down once to set your phone to Silent mode.
- While in the Silent, press Volume Up once to switch to ringtone mode.

# **Adjusting the Media Volume**

While playing music, watching a video or using preloaded or downloaded games or applications, press **Volume Up** or **Volume Down** on the right side of the phone to adjust the media volume.

# Adjusting the Earpiece Volume for Phone Calls

During a phone call, press Volume Up or Volume Down.

# **Connecting Your Phone to the Computer**

You can copy your music, photos, and other files to the microSD card of your phone.

**NOTE**: This option is available only when a microSD card is inserted into the slot of your phone. While your phone is connected to a computer, USB Mass storage mode prevents you from using applications that access the memory card.

- Connect your phone to your computer using the supplied USB cable.
- Open the Notifications panel > tap othe USB options.

- 3. The connected phone is recognized as a removable hard drive on your computer.
- 4. Navigate to the removable drive and open it.
- 5. Choose one of the following:
  - Copy the files from the computer to the microSD card's root folder.
  - Copy the files from the phone's microSD card to a folder in your computer.
- After copying the files, unmount the removable drive (that is, your phone) as required by your computer's operating system to remove your phone safely.
- 7. After unmounting the removable drive, you can disconnect the phone from the computer.

# **Contacts**

You can store and manage your contacts. You can synchronize with personal accounts added to your device. Accounts may also support email, calendars, and other features.

### To access Contacts

From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all Apps > tap
 Contacts .

# Create a Contact

- 1. Launch **Contacts** > tap + to create a new contact.
- Enter the details for the contact.
- 3. Tap **Save**.

# **Edit a Contact**

When editing a contact, you can tap a field and change or delete information, or you can add more fields to the contact's list of information.

- 1. Launch Contact > tap a contact.
- 2. Tap / to edit the contact.
- 3. Tap any of the fields to add, change, or delete information.
- 4. Tap Save.

# Share a Contact

You can share a contact with others by using various sharing methods.

- 1. Launch Contacts > tap a contact to share.
- 2. Tap > Share.
- 3. Tap either Name or Phone number or both.

- 4. Tap Continue.
- 5. Choose a sharing method and follow the prompts...

# **Delete a Contact**

You can delete a single contact or multiple contacts.

- Launch Contacts.
  - You can touch and hold a contact > tap iii to delete and confirm when prompted.

-or-

Tap the contact > tap : > Delete and confirm when prompted.

# **Favorites**

When you mark contacts as favorites, they are grouped at the top of your contact list and easily accessible from other apps.

- 1. Launch **Contacts** > tap a contact.
- 2. Tap ☆ to mark the contact as a favorite.
  - To remove the contact from Favorites, tap \*

# **Phone Calls**

# **Making Calls**

The simplest way to make a call is to dial the number directly. You can also call numbers listed in your Call log or Contacts list.

# Making a call from the dialer screen

- From the Home screen, tap or swipe up to reveal all your Apps > tap .
- 2. Tap the **Keypad** > and then the number you want to dial.
- 3. Tap 🕓 to dial the number.
  - The Calling screen displays and appears in the Status bar while the call is active.
  - To change the volume during a call, press Volume Up / Volume Down.
- 4. Tap 春 to end the call.

### Making a call from the Contacts

- From the Home screen, tap Phone > Contacts Or swipe up to reveal all your Apps > Contacts .
- 2. Scroll through the contact list.
  - To find a specific contact, you can search by tapping
     Search. Enter the name of the contact you're searching for. As you type, contacts with matching names appear below the search box. Or you can use the tab on the right side of the screen to scroll through the alphabetical contacts.
- 3. Tap the contact you want to call.

# Making a call from Recents

All incoming, outgoing, and missed calls are recorded in the Call log.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap \( \screen > \text{ \text{\text{\$\screen\$}}} \) Recents.
- 2. Tap \( \text{to the right of the entry.} \)
  - If you want to edit a number before calling, tap and hold the desired entry, and then tap Edit number before the call.

# **Answering Calls**

When you receive a phone call, the screen displays the caller's name, phone number, and caller ID icon (if stored in Contacts). When you receive a phone call from a phone number not stored in your Contacts, only the default caller ID icon and phone number are shown.

### To answer or decline an incoming call

- On the incoming call screen, tap ANSWER to answer the call.
- 2. Tap **DECLINE** to reject the call.
  - If you were already on a call, the first call is placed on hold while answering the new call.
  - To silence the ringer before answering the call, press either of the volume keys.
- 3. Tap a to end the call.

**NOTE**: The caller you reject is sent directly to your voicemail box to leave a message.

# **Making an International Call**

- From the Home screen, tap \( \bigcup \) Phone.
- 2. Tap and hold **0** until the international prefix '+' appears.
- 3. Tap the country code, area code, and phone number.
- 4. Tap o to dial the number.

# **Making a Video Call**

- 1. From the Home screen, tap 📞 .
- 2. Enter the number and tap \(\sum\_1\) to place a video call.

-or-

- 3. From the Home screen, tap > Recents.
- 4. Select the number and tap \(\sum\_{\psi}\) to place a video call.

**NOTE**: Not all devices support video calling. The receiver has the option to accept the video call or answer the call as a regular voice call

# **Using In-Call Options**

When a call is in progress, the following options are available:

Keypad	Tap <b>Keypad</b> to enter different numbers during your call.
Mute	You can unmute the microphone by tapping the <b>Mute</b> icon again.
Audio	You can turn the speakerphone off by tapping the <b>Speaker</b> icon again.
	The speaker turns OFF automatically when your current call ends.
Add call	Tap <b>Add call</b> to put the current phone call on hold and add another person to the phone call.
Bluetooth	When a Bluetooth device is paired and connected to your phone, you can conduct all calls using Bluetooth for hands-free conversation. When using a Bluetooth headset during a call, the current call screen has a blue border, and the Ongoing Call icon turns blue in the Status bar.
	Tap the <b>Bluetooth</b> icon to toggle in-call audio to and from the Bluetooth accessory.

**NOTE**: To avoid damaging your hearing, do not hold the phone up to your ear when the speakerphone is ON.

# Manage Calls

Your calls are recorded in a call log. You can set up speed dials, block numbers, and use voicemail.

# **Call Log**

The numbers of the calls you have dialed, received, or missed are stored in the Call log.

### Save a Contact from Recents

- From the Home screen, tap \( \screen > \) Recents.
- 2. Tap the desired entry > Add to a contact.
- In the list of contacts that opens, tap Create new contact or add the phone number to the existing contact.
- 4. Tap Done.

### Clear the Call log

- From the Home screen, tap \( \screen > \text{ \screen} \) Recents.
- 2. Tap : > Call history > : > Clear call history > OK.
  - To remove just one entry from the Recents menu, touch and hold the entry > tap Delete > OK to confirm the deletion.

### **Block a Number**

By adding a caller to your Block list, future calls from this number are sent directly to your voicemail, and messages are not received.

- From the Home screen, tap \( \screen > \) Recents.
- 2. Tap the caller you want to add to the Block list.
- 3. Tap Block number and confirm when prompted.

# Speed Dial

You can assign a shortcut number to a contact for speed dialing their default number.

- 1. From 📞, tap **keypad**.
- 2. Touch and hold a number. The speed dial numbers screen displays the reserved speed dial numbers.

NOTE: Number 1 is reserved for Voicemail.

 Type a phone number or tap to assign a contact to the selected number. The selected contact is displayed in the Speed dial number box.

### Make a call with speed dial

You can make a call using Speed dial.

- From the Home screen, tap \ Phone.
- 2. Touch and hold the speed dial number.

### **Emergency Calls**

Your phone supports international emergency numbers such as 911. Emergency calling is supported anywhere the phone has a network signal.

### Making an emergency call

- 1. From the Home screen, tap 📞.
- 2. Enter the emergency number (911).
- 3. Tap \(\frac{1}{2}\) to dial the number.
- 4. Tap to end the call.

# Making an emergency call while the phone is locked

- When your phone has no service status, the Emergency call button is displayed on the lock screen.
- 2. Tap Emergency call.
- 3. Enter the emergency number (911).
- 4. Tap to dial the number.
- Tap to end the call.

# Voicemail

# **Listening to Your Voicemail**

The voicemail application is displayed only when phone calls are available.

When you have a new voicemail message, on appears in the Status bar.

### Calling your voicemail from the keypad

- From the Home screen, tap <a> \bigcup\_{\text{.}}</a>.
- Tap your phone number and to dial the number.

### Calling your voicemail from the Notification panel

Open the Notifications panel and tap New voicemail.

# Messaging

Use the Message app to send and receive SMS and MMS.

### To access message

- From the Home screen, tap to open the message screen.
- Tap an existing message thread to open a conversation.
- Tap Q to search for a message using keywords.

# Sending a Message

- On the message screen, tap to compose a new message.
- 2. Tap the field to add recipients.
- 3. Type your message in the text message field.
- 4. Tap to send the SMS.

# Replying/Forwarding a Message

- On the message screen, tap the message you want to reply to or forward.
- 2. Edit the message if required.
- 3. Tap to send.

# **Deleting a Message/Thread**

- Touch and hold the message or thread you want to delete on the message screen.
- 2. Tap iii to delete the conversation.
- 3. Tap **Delete** to confirm the prompt.

# **Message Settings**

1. On the message screen, tap • to view the settings list. Modify the settings based on your preferences.

# Sending a Multimedia Message (MMS)

To compose a multimedia message, start by creating a new text and adding an attachment.

- From the Home screen, swipe up to reveal all your Apps > tap to open messages.
- 2. Tap Start chat.
- Enter the phone number in the **To** field or select recipients from the contact list.
- 4. Type your message in the text message field.
- Tap 
   to add an attachment. Choose the type of attachment.
  - GIFs
  - Stickers
  - Videos -Select a video.
  - Files.
  - Location
  - Contacts
  - Schedule send
- 6. Tap between to send MMS.

# **Email**

Use the Email app to view and manage your email accounts. You can add multiple email accounts to your Orbic device.

#### To access the email account

 Tap Home key ○ > swipe up for Apps > Settings ☑ > Passwords & accounts.

# **Adding an Account**

- 1. Tap Passwords & accounts > + Add account.
- 2. Tap the type of account you wish to add.
- 3. Enter the email address and password.
- 4. Follow the prompts to set up your email account.

**NOTE**: It may be necessary to ask your system administrator or IT support for some information.

# Removing an Account

- Tap Passwords & accounts and select the account that you want to remove.
- 2. Tap **REMOVE ACCOUNT**.
- Confirm the prompt to remove the account or Cancel to retain the account.

# Composing an Email

- 4. If entering the recipients manually, enter additional recipients by separating each with a semicolon (;).
- 5. Enter the subject for the email and compose the message.

- Review your message and tap

# Responding to an Email

**NOTE**: You must turn ON the location services to view your location and get directions.

#### To turn ON the location services

- Tap to enable the **Use location** option. Maps may not be available for all locations.

# **Opening and Viewing Maps**

### Viewing location details

- 1. Launch Maps.
- The Maps display your location and point north for your reference.
- 3. Swipe to any direction on the screen to use the maps.
- While viewing a map, tap and hold a location, starred place, or a search result on the map. A balloon appears over the location with summary information.
- 5. Tap the balloon to see the address or more information.

### Viewing a location in Street view

Street view mode provides a street-level view of the location. Street view may not be available for all areas.

- Launch Maps > tap ⊗ > tap Street View under Map details.
- 2. Swipe the screen in any direction to view surrounding areas.

### Searching for a location

You can search Google Maps for specific locations, company names, or business types.

- 1. Launch Maps > tap Search.
- Enter the search criteria. As you type, suggested matches from your contacts, the web, and previously searched items are displayed.
  - Tap

  - Tap a suggested search term.
- The search results are displayed as with letter labels on the map.
  - Tap markers and titles to view more information.

### Viewing map layers

The first thing you see on Google Maps is a street map. You can view additional map layers, such as satellite images and traffic information. You can also view custom web-created Google Maps.

- 2. Under Map Type, you can select any of the options:

  - Satellite: To view satellite images of a specific area.

- 6. Enter your destination in the Choose destination field.
- 7. Choose your desired method of transportation.









# Camera

Use the Camera app to take pictures and record videos.

#### To access camera

From the Home screen > tap



- 1. Tap on to access the camera.
- Aim the camera at the subject using the device's main display screen as a viewfinder.
- 3. Pinch the screen to zoom in or pinch open to zoom out.
- 4. Before taking a picture, you can tap on the screen icons to access various camera options and settings.
- Tap a to click a photo. You can also use the volume keys to click a picture.

**WARNING!** Use the flash from a safe distance. Keep the flash away from people and animals' eyes.



# **Recording a Video**

- 1. From the Home screen tap .
- 2. Tap **Video** on the screen to switch to the video mode.
- Aim the camera at the subject using the device's main display screen as a viewfinder.
- 4. Pinch the screen to zoom in or pinch open to zoom out.
- 5. Tap to start recording the video.



# **Camera Settings**

Before capturing a picture or video, you can adjust the camera settings to suit your preferences.

- From the Home screen > tap > Settings on the top right corner of the screen.
- 2. Customize the settings based on your preferences.

### **ProMode**

Using Pro mode, you can edit your photos and videos exactly the way you want.

You can manually adjust ISO, shutter speed, and exposure levels, add filters and adjust the white balance settings to accommodate different lighting conditions.

#### To access ProMode

- 1. Launch **Camera** > tap **ProMode** on the screen.
- Tap on the available Camera settings and adjust them to suit your preferences.
  - Exposure The Exposure compensation is easy to identify because of its + and – symbols. Even if you have set the exposure to where you want it to, this setting can tweak to a little lighter or darker. Manual modes will often do this automatically, but it is a setting you can adjust yourself.
  - Aperture & Shutter Speed You can adjust the shutter speed. A slow shutter speed lets in more light, resulting in brighter photos or videos. Fast shutter speeds allow less light to enter. This is ideal for capturing photos or videos of fast-moving subjects.
  - White Balance The white balance adjusts the color temperature. The blue end of the spectrum is the cold end. Orange, or warm, is on the other end of the spectrum. This can be adjusted while taking a photo to make it look more realistic.

- ISO An ISO value determines the camera's sensitivity to light. Poorly lit or fast-moving subjects benefit from high values. It is ideal to use low values for brightly lit or stationary subjects.
- Zoom To make the image on the screen grow larger.



# Calendar

Use the calendar app to manage your tasks and events.

#### To access calendar

Tap the **Home key**  $\bigcirc$  > swipe up for **Apps** > **Calendar**  $\boxed{1}$ .



# Creating an Event

- Launch Calendar > tap + to add a new event.
- 2. Enter the details for the event.
- 3. Tap Save.

# Editing/Deleting an Event

- 1. Launch Calendar > tap the event you want to edit/delete.
- 2. Tap **Edit** to modify the event details > tap **Save**.

# **Getting Connected**

### Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi refers to certain types of Wireless Local Area Networks (WLAN), and Communication via Wi-Fi requires an access point.

#### Turn Wi-Fi ON

Turning on Wi-Fi will make your device discover and connect to wireless access points within the range.

  - Remove animations Remove certain screen effects if you are sensitive to motion.
  - Large mouse pointer Use a large pointer for a connected mouse.
  - High contrast text Adjust the color and outline of the text to increase the contrast with the background.
- 5. Tap Extra dim to dim the screen beyond the minimum brightness setting for more comfortable viewing.
- 6. Tap Dark theme to enable the black background to help keep the battery alive longer on some screens.
- 7. Tap **Magnification** to magnify the content shown on the screen.
