Read this manual before operating your device and keep it for future reference.

Getting Started

This guide helps you learn about your device hardware, assembl procedures, and how to get started using your device.

Assemble Your Device

Prior to use, it is necessary to install the SIM card, memory card and charge the battery.

Your device uses a nano-SIM card. A SIM card may be preinstalled or may be able to use your previous SIM card.

Installing an SD Card/SIM Card

To install a SIM card or a micro-SD, power off the device and follow the below steps –


- Insert the SIM pin tool into the SIM pinhole on the tray to open the tray.
- 2. Insert the microSD card with the gold contacts facing down and close the tray.

Charging the Battery

Before using your phone, you must fully charge the battery (100%).

Warning! Use only approved charging devices and batteries. Using other accessories may void your warranty and may damage your device.

- 1. Plug the USB cable into the USB power adapter.
- 2. Plug the power adapter into a standard outlet.
- Plug the other end of the USB cable into the phone's micro USB port.
- 4. The USB icon on the cable should always face up when connecting the cable to your device, as shown.



NOTE:

- Charge your device's battery with the device turned off to maximize efficiency.
- · Over time, battery life decreases steadily.
- Do not charge the battery for longer than eight hours.

Set Up Your Device

Turn Your Device ON/OFF

The instructions below explain how to turn your device ON or OFF.

To Turn the Device ON

 Press and hold the Power/Lock key until the device turns ON.

NOTE: The first time you use your phone, you'll need to set it up.

To Turn the Device OFF

- If the display is off, press **Power/Lock** to turn it back on.
- Press and hold Power/Lock for a few seconds.
- When the phone options menu appears, tap Power OFF.
- Tap **OK**.

Initial Setup

The first time you turn your device ON (or after a reset to factory settings), the on-screen prompts guide you through the basics of setting up your device.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, set up accounts, choose location services, learn about your device's features, and more.

Secure Your Device

You can use your device's screen lock features to secure your device.

- To lock the device, press the Power key.
- To unlock the device, press the **Power** key and swipe up to open.

Touchscreen Gestures

Тар	You can select on-screen items such as application icons or settings buttons by touching them with your finger.
Tap and Hold	Touch and hold your finger over the item to open its options.
Swipe or Slide	Drag your finger horizontally or vertically across the screen.
Drag	Tap and hold your finger before you begin to drag and hold your finger down until the item reaches your desired location.
Flick	Swiping the screen is similar to flicking, but you need to swipe it with lighter and quicker strokes instead.
	Finger gestures are always vertical. For example, flicking through contacts or messages.
Rotate	You can change the orientation of most screens from portrait to landscape simply by turning the phone sideways. Turning the phone sideways will bring up a larger on-screen keyboard.

Know Your Device

Home Screen

The Home screen serves as the start of your experience.



The Home screen is displayed when the device is in idle mode.

The Home screen allows you to add shortcuts, folders, and widgets to your favorite apps to be easily accessible.

To access the Home screen

Press Home
 to return to the center of the home screen.

Previewing the Home Screen

From any Home screen, tap and hold the desired application. The application moves to your selected home screen once you select it.

Customizing the Home Screen

You can customize the home screen and the display wallpaper.

Moving an Item on the Home Screen

To move/drag an item on the home screen,

- 1. Open the Home screen you want to customize.
- 2. Tap and hold the item you want to move until it vibrates.
- 3. Drag the item to a new location on your Home screen.
- 4. Point your finger at the location where you want the item.

NOTE: To add shortcuts to a Home screen, swipe up from your app list to reveal all your applications. Next, find the app you wish to add, tap and hold on the item, and drag it onto the Home screen.

Removing an Item from the Home Screen

To remove an item from the home screen,

- 1. From the Home screen, tap and hold an item until it vibrates.
- 2. Drag the item to X **Remove** to delete the item.

Changing the Wallpaper of the Home Screen

- From the Home screen, tap and hold any empty area on the Home screen for a few seconds.
- Tap Wallpapers. Choose a photo from your camera gallery or memory card.
- 3. Tap Set Wallpaper.

Widgets

Widgets are extensions for applications that appear on the Home screen. Widgets include links to a specific contact, Internet bookmarks, Gmail and email accounts, and many more.

Add a Widget to a Home Screen

- Touch and hold any empty area on the Home screen > select Widgets.
- Touch and hold the required widget, drag it to the Home screen and release it.

Remove a Widget

- Touch and hold the Widget you want to remove from the Home screen.
- 2. Drag the widget to X Remove and release it.

NOTE: By removing a widget, you are not deleting it but instead removing it from the Home screen.

App Shortcuts

You can add a shortcut to the Home screen.

Adding an App Shortcut

- Touch and hold any preloaded or downloaded app on the Home screen.
- 2. Drag the app to the screen and release it.

Removing the Shortcut

- Touch and hold the app shortcut you want to remove from the Home screen.
- 2. Drag the app shortcut to X Remove and release it.

Folders

Use folders to organize items on your Home screen.

Creating/Removing a Folder

- 1. Drag one application over another to create a folder.
- 2. You can name a folder and drag other applications into it after it is created.
- You can move folders in the same way that you move applications.
- 4. To remove a folder, touch and hold the folder that you want to remove, drag the folder to **X Remove** and release it.

Status Bar

The Status Bar at the top of the home screen provides device information (such as network status, battery charge, and time) on the right side and notification alerts on the left.

Notification Panel

Notification icons on the Status Bar display calendar events, device status, and more.

Viewing and Responding to Notifications

- Tap and hold the Status bar, and slide your finger downward to open the Notifications panel. If you have multiple notifications, you may have to scroll to them all.
- 2. Tap the desired notification to respond.
- To close the notification panel, drag the bottom bar of the panel or tap Back.



Using the On-screen Keyboard

Type your text input using the onboard keyboard. The keyboard opens automatically in some applications. For others, tap anywhere in a text field to launch the keyboard.

- 1. Tap each letter on the on-screen keypad.
- Tap and hold a letter for additional key options (not all keys have different options). Other key options include numbers and letters with accent marks. If options are available, you will see a box with all the options shown. Slide your finger to select the character you want.
- 3. You may continue until the word is complete.



- Tap the key marked 3 above while you type. When you release the key, the lowercase letters reappear.
- Turn caps lock on double-tap or touch & hold.
- Tap the key marked 3 and tap the shift key again to return to lowercase.
- Tap the key marked 1 to delete words, tap 4 so you can change the number, and sign the keyboard.
- To hide the Android keyboard, tap the Back.
- When writing a new message, you can tap 2 to skip from the receiver to the text frame.

NOTE: You can select input methods when typing in the notification panel.

Adding/Editing/Deleting Words in the User Dictionary

The predictive text dictionary may require the addition of a word, for example, a name or a technical term.

If you want to add a word to your User Dictionary while typing,

Double-tap it to highlight it, tap and hold the word, and select
 Add to dictionary.

If you want to add a word manually,

- From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your Apps
 > find and tap the Settings
 .
- 2. Scroll down and tap the **System** (i) .
- 3. Tap Language & input (1) .
- 4. Tap **Personal Dictionary** and tap the **plus sign** + .
- 5. Type the word \rightarrow **Enter** on the keyboard.

Editing/Deleting a Word

- From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your Apps > find and tap the Settings .
- 2. Scroll down and Tap the **System** () .
- 4. Tap **Personal Dictionary** > tap the word to delete or edit.
- 5. Tap 📺 to delete the word.

Editing Text

You can select, copy or cut the text you've entered, then paste it in another text field within the user interface.

NOTE: Some applications may offer different text editing methods.

Select the Text

- 1. Tap the text field.
- 2. Move the cursor to the beginning or end of the desired text by tapping in the location you want the cursor.
- 3. Tap and hold the text field.
- 4. Tap **Select word** in the pop-up menu or tap **Select all** to select all the text in the text field.
- Drag your finger to move the text cursor to a letter within the text that you want to select. The selected text is highlighted in orange.

Cut/Copy the Text

- 1. Double-click to select the text to cut or copy it.
- 2. Tap and hold the selected text.
- 3. Tap Cut or Copy in the menu that opens.



 If you tap Cut, the selected text is removed from the text field. In this case, the text is saved to the clipboard, so that you can paste it into another text field.

Paste the Text

- 1. Cut or copy the text to paste.
- 2. Tap the text field where you want to paste the text and move the cursor to your desired location.
 - You can paste text that you copied from one application into the text field in any other application.
- 3. Tap and hold, then select Paste in the pop-up menu.
 - The text is inserted after the cursor. The text also remains in the clipboard, so you can paste that same text into another location.

NOTE: When you type, the notification panel will have a "selectin-put method" so you can set the input methods.

Glide Typing

The Google Keyboard allows you to slide your finger across the letters to spell the word.

To enable glide typing

- 1. Touch and hold the comma (,) > tap **Settings** > **Glide Typing**.
- Touch Enable Gesture Typing to turn ON/OFF. Slide your finger from letter to letter to spell a word.
- Do not lift your finger until you have completed spelling a word.

Google Voice Typing

Use voice recognition to convert speech to text. You must be connected to mobile data or Wi-Fi.

To enable Google voice typing

- 1. Tap on the Google search bar.
- 2. When "Try saying something" appears, speak your text.
- Tap
 [♥] to end recording.

Adding, Editing or Deleting Words in the User Dictionary

Sometimes you may need to add a word to the predictive text dictionary, for example, a name or a specialized technical word. If you want to add a word to your User dictionary while entering text, double tap the word to highlight it, then tap and hold the word and select Add ** to dictionary.

Adding a word manually

- From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your Apps > find and tap the Settings > System.
- 2. Tap Language & input > Personal dictionary.
- 3. Tap the plus sign and type the word and the shortcut.
- 4. Hit **Enter** on the keyboard to save.

Editing or deleting a word

- From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your Apps find and tap the Settings .
- 2. Tap Language & input > Personal dictionary.
- 3. Type the word to delete or edit.
- 4. Tap the trash can to delete the word or Enter to save the edit.

Selecting Text

You can select, copy or cut the text you've entered, then paste it in another text field within the user interface.

NOTE: Some applications may offer different text editing methods.

Selecting text

- 1. Tap the text field.
- 2. Move the cursor to the beginning or end of the desired text by tapping in the location you want the cursor.
- 3. Tap and hold the text field.
- 4. Tap Select word in the pop-up menu or tap Select all to select all the text in the text field.
- 5. Drag your finger to move the text cursor to a letter within the text that you want to select.

Cutting and Copying the Text

- 1. Double-click to select the text to cut or copy it.
- 2. Tap and hold the selected text.
- 3. Tap Cut or Copy in the menu that opens.
 - If you tap Cut, the selected text is removed from the text field. In this case, the text is saved to the clipboard, so that you can paste it into another text field.

Pasting the Text

- 1. Cut or copy the text to paste.
- Tap the text field where you want to paste the text and move the cursor to your desired location.
 - You can paste text that you copied from one application into the text field in any otherapplication.
- 3. Tap and hold, then select Paste in the pop-up menu.
 - The text is inserted after the cursor. The text also remains in the clipboard, so you can paste that same text into another location.

Screen Timeout/Sleep Mode ON

Sleep mode saves battery power by turning off your display. You will still receive messages and calls when the display is turned.

Switching to Screen timeout mode

- Press Power/Lock to switch your phone to Screen timeout mode.
- 2. Your phone automatically turns off the display after a period of inactivity.

To customize the screen timeout settings,

From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your Apps ::::
 > Settings

 ○ > Display > Screen timeout.

Waking up from Screen timeout mode

- Your phone automatically wakes up when you have an incoming call.
- To wake it up manually, tap Power/Lock. You'll need to unlock the screen as described below.


Unlocking the screen

Press and hold the Lock screen to unlock the screen.

NOTE: If you have set up a screen unlock pattern, pin, or password, you will be asked to draw the pattern on the screen or enter the PIN or password to access the phone software.

Activating Secure Screen Lock

- - If you have already configured the screen lock, tap Screen lock to change.
- 2. Tap Pattern, PIN, or Password.
- 3. Enter the custom pattern, PIN, or password as prompted.



 If you select 'None', the screen unlock security will be cancelled.

Adjusting Volume

Ringtone and Media volume are independent of each other and adjusted separately.

Adjusting the Ringer Volume

From the Home screen, press Volume up or Volume down on the right side of the phone to

- Adjust the ringer volume to your desired level.
- While in the lowest ringer volume level, press Volume Down once to set your phone to Silent mode.
- While in the Silent, press Volume Up once to switch to ringtone mode.

Adjusting the Media Volume

While playing music, watching a video or using preloaded or downloaded games or applications, press Volume Up or Volume Down on the right side of the phone to adjust the media volume.

Adjusting the Earpiece Volume for Phone Calls

During a phone call, press Volume Up or Volume Down.

Adjusting the volume via Settings menu

- From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your Apps :::
 then find and tap Settings (a)
- 2. Tap Sound.
- Drag the volume sliders left or right to adjust your phone's Media, Call, Ring & notification, and Alarm.
- 4. Your phone plays a sample tone at the selected volume level while you drag the slider.

Connecting Your Phone to the Computer

You can copy your music, photos, and other files to the microSD card of your phone.

NOTE: This option is available only when a microSD card is inserted into the slot of your phone. While your phone is connected to a computer, USB Mass storage mode prevents you from using applications that access the memory card.

- Connect your phone to your computer using the supplied USB cable.
- 2. Open the Notifications panel > tap **USB options**.
- On your computer, the connected phone is recognized as a removable hard drive.
- 4. Navigate to the removable drive and open it.
- 5. Choose one of the following:
 - Copy the files from the computer to the microSD card's root folder.
 - Copy the files from the phone's microSD card to afolder in your computer.
- After copying the files, unmount the removable drive (that is, your phone) as required by your computer's operating system to safely remove your phone.
- After you have un-mounted the removable drive, you can disconnect the phone from the computer.

Phone Calls

Making Calls

The simplest way to make a call is to dial the number directly. You can also call numbers listed in your call log or Contacts list.

Making a call from the dialer screen

- From the Home screen, tap Phone . Or Swipe up to reveal all your Apps then find and tap on Phone .
- 2. Tap the Dial Pad 🕛 > and then the number you want to dial.
- 3. Tap **Dial** .
 - The Calling screen is shown and \(\squappears \) appears in the Status bar while the call is active
 - To change the volume during a call, press Volume Up / Volume Down.
- 4. To end the call, tap a End Call.

Making an International Call

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **_ Phone**.
- 2. Tap and hold 0 until the international prefix '+' appears.
- 3. Tap the country code, area code, and phone number.
- 4. Tap 📞 Dial.

Calling from the Recents Call Menu

Your phone logs all incoming and outgoing calls.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap \ Phone > \ Recents.
- 2. Tap **\(\) Dial** at the right of any entry to dial.
 - Calls are listed with the most recent at the top.
 - Calls to the same phone number are grouped together.
 - Scroll up or down to view additional entries in the log.
 - If you want to edit a number before calling, tap and hold the desired number, and then tap Edit number before call.

Making a call from the Contact list

- From the Home screen, tap Phone > Contacts Or Swipe up to reveal all your Apps > Contacts >
- 2. Scroll through the contact list.
 - To find a specific contact, you can search by tapping
 Search. Enter the name of the contact you're searching for. As you type, contacts with matching names appear below the search box. Or you can use the tab on the right side of the screen to scroll through the alphabetical contacts.
- 3. Tap the **contact** you want to call.

Making an Emergency Call

Your phone supports international emergency numbers such as 911. Emergency calling is supported anywhere the phone has a network signal.

Making an emergency call

- From the Home screen, tap \ Phone.
- 2. Tap the emergency number for your location.
 - This is usually 911, *911 or #911.
- 3. Tap **Dial** 🕓 .
- 4. To end the emergency call, tap Call.

Making an emergency call while the phone is locked

- When your phone has no service status, Emergency call button is displayed on the lock screen.
 - Tap Emergency call.
- 2. Tap the emergency number for your location.
 - This is usually 911, *911 or #911.
- 3. Tap **Dial** 🕓 .

Answering or Rejecting Calls

When you receive a phone call, the screen displays the caller's name, phone number, and caller ID icon (if stored in Contacts). When you receive a phone call from a phone number not stored in your Contacts, only the default caller ID icon and phone number are shown.

All incoming calls are recorded in the Call log. If you miss a call, you receive a reminder notification.

Answering or declining an incoming call

- A notification of an incoming call will appear towards the top of the screen.
- Press **DECLINE** to reject the call or press **ANSWER** to answer the call.
 - If you were already in a call, the first call is placed on hold during answering the new call.

To silence the ringer before answering the call, press either of the volume keys.

NOTE: The caller you reject is sent directly to your voicemail box to leave a message.



Checking missed calls

- If you miss a call,
 is displayed in the Status bar.
- If you open the Notifications panel, you will see the number of missed calls. Tap the notification to be taken to the call log and view detailed information.

Using In-Call Options

When a call is in progress, the following options are available:

Dial Pad	Tap Dial Pad to enter additional numbers during your call.
Mute	You can unmute the microphone by tapping Mute icon again.
Audio	You can turn the speakerphone off by tapping the Speaker icon again.
	The speaker is turned off automatically when your current call ends.
Add call	Tap Add call to put the current phone call on hold and add another person to the phone call.
Bluetooth	When a Bluetooth device is paired and connected to your phone, you can conduct all calls using Bluetooth for hands-free conversation. When using Bluetooth headset during a call, the current call screen has a blue border and the Ongoing Call icon turns blue in the Status bar.
	Tap Bluetooth icon to toggle in-call audio to and from the Bluetooth accessory.

NOTE: To avoid damaging your hearing, do not hold the phone up to your ear when the speakerphone is on.

Using the Recent Call Menu

The phone stores the numbers of all incoming and outgoing calls in the Call log. The recent call displays the details of the call including time, date, and duration.

Opening the Recents menu

- From the Home screen, tap \(\bigcup \) Phone > \(\Qrightarrow \) Recents.
 - Calls are listed with the most recent at the top. Calls of the same phone number are grouped together. Scroll to view earlier entries in the log.

NOTE: You can tap and hold the desired number in the call log list to select options such as **Copy number**, **Edit number before call**, **Block number**, and **Delete**.





Calling a number from the Recents menu

- 1. From the Home screen, tap \ Phone > \ Recents.
- If you want to call a number directly, tap \(\cdot \) to the right of the entry. Or select a contact > tap \(\cdot \) Dial.
 - If you want to edit a number before calling, tap and hold the desired entry, and then tap Edit number before call.

Saving a phone number from your Recents menu

- From the Home screen, tap \ Phone > \ Recents.
- 2. Tap the desired entry > **Add to contacts**.
- 3. In the list of contacts that opens, tap **Create new contact** or add to an existing contact.
- 4. Tap **Done**.

Sending a text message from Recents menu

- 1. From the Home screen, tap \ Phone > \ Recents.
- 2. Tap the contact > **Send text message**.
- 3. Enter your message and tap the letter that appears right beside the space to add text to **Send.**



Clearing the Call log

- 1. From the Home screen, tap \ Phone > \ Recents.
- Tap Option > Call History > Tap Option > Clear call history > OK.
 - To remove just one entry from the Recents menu, touch and hold the entry. In the pop-up options, tap Delete > OK.

Listening to Your Voicemail

Voicemail application is displayed only when phone calls are available.

When you have a new voicemail message, ∞ appears in the Status har.

Calling your voicemail from the Dial Pad

- 1. From the Home screen, tap . Phone
- 2. Tap your phone number and **O Dial.**

Calling your voicemail from the Notification panel

Open the Notifications panel and tap "New voicemail".

Using Voice Dialer

You can use the Voice Search application or Voice Dialer application to place a phone call by speaking the name of a contact or a phone number.

- 1. From the Home screen, tap \(> \) Search contacts.
 - If you have a Bluetooth headset that supports "voicerecognition" or "voice-dialing," you may be able to open Voice Search by pressing and holding your headset's main button and dial by voice using your headset. For details, see your headset manual.

2.	Say the name of the contact you want to call or follow one of the suggestions for dialing a number or controlling your phone in other ways.

Use the Message app to send and receive SMS and MMS.

To access message

- From the Home screen, tap to open the message screen.
- Tap an existing message thread to open a conversation.
- Tap Q to search for a message using keywords.

Sending a Message

- On the message screen, tap to compose a new message.
- 2. Tap the field to add recipients.
- 3. Type your message in the text message field.
- 4. Tap > to send the SMS or MMS.

Replying / Forwarding a Message

- On the message screen, tap the message that you want to reply or forward.
- 2. Edit the message, if required.
- 3. Tap > to send.

Deleting a Message/Thread

- 6. From the message body, tap:
 - View: To view the attached item.
 - · Replace: To change attached files.
 - Remove: To remove attached files.
- 7. Tap > Send MMS.
 - Tap Back to save it as a draft.

Resuming a Draft Message

Searching Messages



Turn Wi-Fi ON

Turning on Wi-Fi will make your device discover and connect to wireless APs within range.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth, or short-range communications, allows you to wirelessly connect your device to several Bluetooth devices that are compatible with your devices such as headsets, computers, printers, and wireless devices that are Bluetooth-enabled.

NOTE: The Bluetooth communication range is approximately 30 feet.

Turn Bluetooth ON/OFF

- Touch the Home key O> swipe up for apps > Settings @> Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth.
- 2. Tap to turn the Bluetooth ON or OFF.
 - Once the Bluetooth is ON, the Will appear in the status bar scan for nearby Bluetooth devices, and displays them.
 - Tap **Scan** to manually perform a scan.

Pair Bluetooth Devices

Bluetooth pairing allows you to establish trusted connections between your device and another Bluetooth device.

- Touch the Home key > swipe up for apps > Settings > Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth.
- Tap •• to turn the Bluetooth ON or OFF. Your device will scan and display the names of all available Bluetooth devices in the area.

3. Tap the name of the device you want to pair with.

NOTE: The Bluetooth passkey, if required, may be fixed for some devices. Try 0000 or 1234, or refer to the instructions that came with the device.

Forgetting a Bluetooth Device

USB Cable

Chrome

Search for information or browse web pages using the Chrome web browser. To access the internet, you must have an active data or Wi-Fi connection.

Opening Chrome

- From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your Apps > then find and tap on Chrome.
 - When you open the Browser, the default homepage is displayed. If you have used the browser recently, your most recently viewed webpage is displayed.
 - The browser also opens when you select a web link in other applications, like email or text messaging

Accessing or Searching the Webpage

- From the Home screen, Swipe up to reveal all your Apps > then find and tap on Chrome.
- 2. Tap the URL field on top of the screen.

Setup and manage connections to a variety of networks and devices.

Wi-Fi

You can connect your device to a Wi-Fi network to access the Internet without using your mobile data.

To enable Wi-Fi,

- 1. Tap Settings ② > Network & internet > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Tap to turn ON Wi-Fi and scan for available networks.

Mobile network

You can configure your device's ability to connect to mobile networks and use mobile data.

To enable mobile network

- Tap Settings (2) > Network & internet > Mobile network.
 - Mobile data Activate the mobile network.
 - Roaming Choose whether to allow your device to connect to mobile data while traveling outside the network area.
 - App data usage Check your current mobile and Wi-Fi data usage.

- Data warning & limit You can also customize data warnings and limits from Mobile network.
- Preferred network type Choose the desired network.
- Wi-Fi calling Activate the call over mobile network.
- Access Point Names -: Choose or add APNs, which have the network settings your device needs to connect to.

Airplane Mode

The Airplane mode turns off Wi-Fi and Bluetooth and disconnects your device from all networks.

When you are in Airplane mode, you can use other features such as playing music, watching videos, and using offline applications.

To enable Airplane Mode,

- Tap Settings ② > Network & internet > Airplane mode.
- 2. Tap to turn the Airplane mode ON/OFF.

Hotspot & tethering

Mobile hotspot uses your data plan to create a Wi-Fi network that can be used by multiple devices. You can use tethering to share your device's Internet connection with another device.

To enable the hotspot & tethering option,

- Tap Settings (a) > Network & internet > Hotspot & tethering.
- You can choose any of the following based on the reuired settings.
 - Mobile Hotspot
 - USB tethering
 - Bluetooth tethering

Data Saver

Use Data saver to reduce your data consumption by preventing selected apps from sending or receiving data in the background.

To activate data saver

- Tap Settings ② > Network & internet > Data Saver.
- 2. Tap Use Data Saver to turn ON the data saver.
 - To allow some apps to have unrestricted data usage, select Unrestricted data and tap next to each app to specify restrictions.

Connected devices

You can view the list of devices connected through USB and Bluetooth.

Pair New Device

You can pair your device to other Bluetooth-enabled devices. Once a pairing is created, the devices remember each other and can exchange information without having to enter the passkey again.

To pair a new bluetooth device

- Tap Settings ② > Connected devices.
- Tap + Pair new device. Make sure the device bluetooth is turned ON.
- Tap a device listed under Available devices and follow the prompts to connect.

Notifications

You an prioritize and streamline app alerts by changing which apps send notifications.

Manage Notifications

You can configure notifications from apps.

To enable app notifications,

- Tap Settings

 Notifications > App settings under Manage.
- 2. Tap besides each application to receive notifications.
- 3. To view recent and snoozed notifications, tap **Notification history.**

Do Not Disturb

You can Block sounds and notifications while this mode is turned ON. You can also specify exceptions for People, Apps, and Alarms.

To activate this mode,

- Tap Settings Notifications > Do Not Disturb under General.
- 2. Tap TURN ON NOW.

Battery

You can view how the Battery power is used for Device activities.

To view the battery usage details

- Tap Settings ② > Battery.
 - Battery usage Displays the usage details.
 - Battery Saver Activate to concerv battery power.
 - Battery Manager Detects when apps drain battery
 - Battery percentage Displays the battery charge percentage on the status bar.

Storage

You can view the device memory and usage details.

Sound

You can configure the sounds and vibrations use to indicate notifications, screen tap, and other activities.

Adjust the volume

You can set the system volume level and set defalt volume for notifications and other media.

- Tap Settings ② > Sound.
- 2. Drag the sliders to set the volume for -
 - Media
 - Call
 - Ring and notification
 - Alarm

Set Vibration

You can control how and when your device vibrates.

- Tap Settings ② > Sound > Vibrate for calls.
- 2. Choosethe Options to customize -
 - Never vibrate
 - Always vibrate

Set Silent Mode

To turn silent mode off, press the volume key on the side of your device and then tap the silent mode until the bell icon is displayed.

Display

You can configure your display's brightness and screen timeout delay.

- Tap Settings ② > Display.
 - Brightness level Drag the brightness slider to adjust the brightness.
 - Adaptive brightness Tap to enable this option.

Display

 - Color correction Adjust the color of the screen if color-blindness or have diificulty in reading the screen display.
 - Color inversion Revere the display of colors.
 - Remove animations Remove certain screen effects if you are sensitive to motion.
 - Large mouse pointer Use large pointer for a connected mouse.

 High contrast text - Adjust the color and outline of the text to increase the contrast with the background.

Security

You can secure your device and protect your data by using a screen lock. With this option enabled, you can use your finger to draw a pattern or enter a PIN to unlock your device's screen.

To access security

Tap the Home key ○ > swipe up for apps > Settings ⑩ > Security.

Google Play protect

The Google Play protect monitors your apps and devices for harmful behavior. It also warns you from potentially harmful apps.

To run the scan

- 1. Tap Security > Security status > Google Play protect.
- 2. Tap **scan** to check the apps.

Find My Device

Fnd my device helps you locate this device remotely. It also helps you keep your data secure if you lose this device.

To use Find My Device

- 1. Tap Security > Security status > Find My Device.

NOTE: To use this option, you will need to sign in with Google.

Screen lock

 Tap Security > Screen lock under Device security to select a screen lock and level of security.

- None: Never use a screen lock.
- **Swipe**: Swipe the screen to unlock.
- Pattern: Create a pattern that you draw on the screen to unlock your device.
- PIN: Select a PIN to use for unlocking the screen.
- Password: Create a password for unlocking the screen.

NOTE: If you forget your pattern, PIN, or password, you will have to reset your device to factory settings, which will remove all data from your device.

Fingerprint
